- 5. What are you doing?

- 8. How much cash would you need to get started?
- 9. What Textbooks do you read?
- 10. What Journals do you read?
- 11. What are some ideas you have for graduate students?
- 12. Are you an ideas person? How do you find problems to work on?
- 13. Name one problem you would like to solve?
- 14. What is the most important contribution to your field in the past 5 years?
