What is it?

An academically rigorous program designed to enrich mathematical talent and prepare Boston students from underrepresented groups for college mathematics. PRIMES Circle scholars will work with professors and college students at one of the best math departments in the world: the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT).

When is it?

PRIMES Circle takes place throughout the school year, starting in January 2014. Students will meet with their MIT mentor afterschool on the weekly basis from January to December (summer excluded). Applications are due November 1, 2013.

What will I do?

Circle Scholars work with MIT professors and undergraduate student mentors, meet other students talented in mathematics, study phenomenal mathematics outside the high school curriculum, practice creative problem solving, write an expository paper, present at an MIT workshop, and get one step closer to a strong college application.
