Astronaut STEPHANIE D. WILSON

Mission Specialist Stephanie Wilson will discuss her recent mission to the International Space Station aboard space shuttle *Discovery*, STS-121.

Astronaut Stephanie Wilson graduated from Harvard with a BA in Engineering Science and a Master of Science degree in Aerospace Engineering from the University of Texas. Selected by NASA in April 1996, Wilson reported to the Johnson Space Center in August 1996.

Wilson completed her first space flight on STS-121 in July 2006 on the Space Shuttle *Discovery*. Among Wilson's duties as a mission specialist, Wilson was responsible for the transfer of more than 28,000 pounds of supplies and equipment to the ISS and the operation of the robotic arm on scheduled spacewalks.
