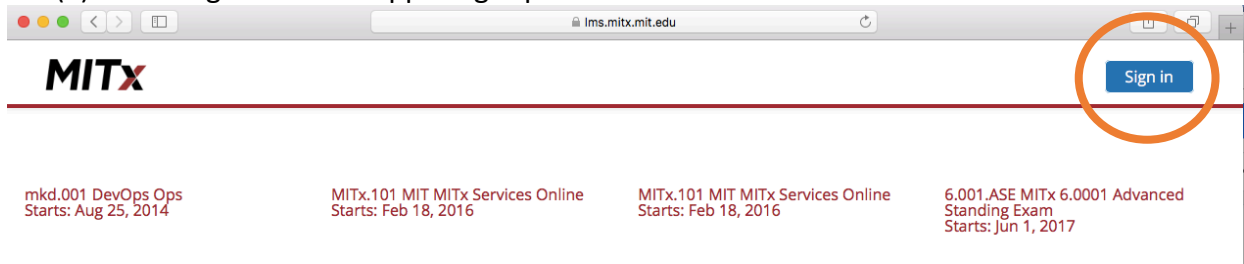


Using MITx

Logging into MITx.

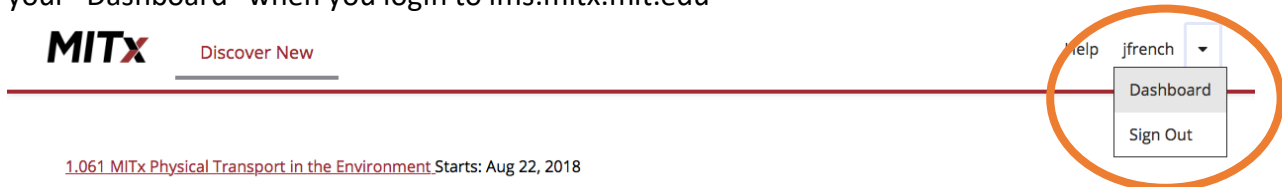
- (1) Go to lms.mitx.mit.edu
- (2) Click “Sign in” in the upper right part of the screen.



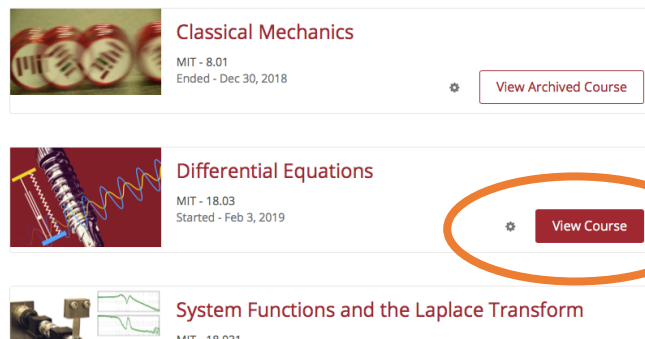
Clicking “sign in” logs you into the MITx system using your MIT certificates. Most errors in this process involve certificate errors. See FAQs below.

Registering for an MITx class.

You will automatically be enrolled in your course if you have registered on Stellar. In this case, the course automatically shows up in your “Dashboard” when you login to lms.mitx.mit.edu



- Congratulations, enter 18.03 online text by clicking “View Course” from your Dashboard.

Frequently Asked Questions

Q: I receive a "400 permission error" when trying to login my course, what do I do?

A:

- Make sure you are using a supported browser: Chrome, Safari or Firefox.
- Delete your browser history.
- Refresh the page.
- Make sure your certificates are loaded properly and there are no old MIT certificates on your machine. Do NOT create a new user login. You must only login using your MIT certificates.

Q: The math isn't loading correctly, what is wrong?

A:

- Use Chrome or Safari for best rendering of math.
- Math is rendered using [mathjax]. It can be slow, so try reloading the page until the math renders correctly.
